RETIREMENT OF PROFESSOR JOHN E. SCHAUFELBERGER



After nearly three decades of service, Professor of Construction Management and CBE Dean Emeritus, [John E. Schaufelberger](#) retired at the end of 2021. Joining the College in 1994, John's career reflects an inspiring commitment as a servant leader and educator. John served as Chair of the Department of Construction Management from 2002 to 2014 and Dean of the College of Built Environments. John shares that his time teaching and empowering undergraduate and graduates remains a highlight of his career.

"We can all aspire to leave behind a legacy as rich as John's. He is a model of leadership integrity for all the organizations he touched and he leaves us in a better place to make a positive impact, particularly to benefit students," said Dean Renée Cheng.

John's impact and legacy is felt in the field of Construction Management and across Built Environments; he has received many accolades through the years including 2010 Construction Industry Hall of Fame Inductee, 2021 Lifetime Achievement Award from the Associated Schools of Construction, and most recently ENR California & Northwest's 2022 Legacy Award.

John's passion for creating pathways for our students and faculty are evident in his establishment of the [John E.
